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The Complainant submits this complaint to the Court and states that there is probable cause to believe Defendant committed the following offense(s):

**COUNT I**

**Charge: Murder in the 2nd Degree (With Intent) (Not Premeditated)**

Minnesota Statute: 609.19.1(1), with reference to: 609.11.5

Maximum Sentence: 295 months -40 Years

Offense Level: Felony

Offense Date (on or about): 01/10/2019

Control #(ICR#): 19008251

Charge Description: On or about January 10, 2019, in the County of Anoka, Minnesota, TRAVON SHUG WALLACE, did cause the death of a human being with intent to effect the death of that person or another, but without premeditation and at the time of offense, the Defendant or an accomplice did use or possess a firearm, to wit: a gun.

## STATEMENT OF PROBABLE CAUSE

At 5:42 pm on January 10, 2019, Fridley police responded to an emergency call regarding a male who had been shot near the 6100 block of 5th Street NE in Fridley, Anoka County. The caller reported an unknown male had knocked on his door seeking help. Upon arrival police found an 18 year old male identified as Keimonte Raclaud White (DOB: 2/5/01) who was suffering from what appeared to be multiple gunshot wounds. The 911 caller said the male getting medical attention is the male who knocked on his door seeking aid. White was transported to HCMC where he later died as a result of the injuries. An autopsy showed White suffered multiple gunshot wounds, including one to his chest which showed contact with a muzzle stamp. Three fired bullets were removed from White.

Two adult males who know White were interviewed. Both males described White as having been contacted to provide a ride to an unknown male individual. The ride was to be for a fee. White and the two friends arrived in a minivan near the 6100 block of 5th Street NE in Fridley to provide the ride. The unknown male entered the back of the van where White was. The unknown male is described as having been wearing a black poofy winter coat with a fur lined hood. After just a few moments, the friends described the unknown male shooting White multiple times. The two friends fled the van fearing for their own lives, leaving White behind. They also described the unknown male fleeing the parked van.

At this same time, an adult female (witness #1) who is known to law enforcement was sitting in a parked car behind 6152 5th Street NE in Fridley, Anoka County. The minivan with White was parked in the street on the other side of the residence. The female says she was in her car with her boyfriend, Tamarr Brayon Long (DOB: 11/9/98), defendant Long herein. The female described at one point while sitting in the car together, prior to hearing any shots fired, defendant Long left the car and returned with a handgun in the front pocket of his sweatshirt. A short time later, defendant Long left the car and went into 6152 5th Street via a backdoor near where she was parked. 6152 is the end unit. When defendant Long returned again, he did not have the handgun. The female then heard shots a few minutes later. Moments later, the female saw a male wearing a dark winter coat with a fur hood collar come from around the far side of the building and go directly into the rear door of 6152. Defendant Long then exited the car and returned to the rear door of 6152. Then, a few moments later, defendant Long exited 6152 and returned to the car. At this time, defendant Long again had the gun in his possession. The female says defendant Long told her to leave. The female described seeing a person walking outside who appeared to be hurt and looking for help.

Detectives identified a neighbor (witness #2) who had returned home at about 5:40 on January 10th. The neighbor described being in the parking lot behind the nearest building getting children out of the car. The neighbor heard what sounded like gunshots. The neighbor then saw a male wearing a dark winter coat with a fur hood come around the corner from the front of the building and go into the far, or end unit.

Detectives spoke with a male (witness #3). The witness described seeing defendant Long later in the evening of January 10th. Witness #3 described meeting up with defendant Long about 8:00 pm on the 10th. This occurred in the south metro area. The witness said defendant Long admitted a "dude" had been shot a bit earlier and showed a gun, stating it was the gun used in the shooting. The witness said defendant Long described his "cousin" as the one who did the shooting and referenced Fridley. The gun is described as a silver handgun with a brown/black handle. Defendant Long admitted his "cousin" handed him the gun after the shooting and he was driven by his girlfriend away from the location. Defendant Long admitted his girlfriend was at the scene of the shooting. The gun has not yet been located.

Defendant Long's "cousin" is identified as Travon Shug Wallace (DOB: 11/13/94), the defendant herein. Defendant Wallace resides at 6152 5th Street NE in Fridley with his Godmother. On Saturday January 12, 2019, a search warrant was executed at 6152 5th Street NE. Also searched was a vehicle in which both defendants had been seen in since the time of the shooting. In the vehicle, detectives located a dark colored winter jacket with a fur hood which was stuffed into a bag. Defendant Wallace's Godmother identified the jacket as belonging to

Defendant Wallace. The jacket also has what appeared to be a through and through gunshot hole in a sleeve. The Godmother stated she was not home during the late afternoon hours of January 10th until about 9:00pm.

## SIGNATURES AND APPROVALS

Complainant requests that Defendant, subject to bail or conditions of release, be:  
(1) arrested or that other lawful steps be taken to obtain Defendant's appearance in court; or  
(2) detained, if already in custody, pending further proceedings; and that said Defendant otherwise be dealt with according to law.

Complainant declares under penalty of perjury that everything stated in this document is true and correct. Minn. Stat. § 358.116; Minn. R. Crim. P. 2.01, subds. 1, 2.
