



Ramsey



- Miles of multi-use paths, like the MRT, connect Ramsey to destinations across the region
- Northstar train service is convenient, with free parking and a great location just steps away from hundreds of homes, apartments, and condos
- Transit Link service for first and last-mile transit use
- Bikes, e-bikes and e-scooters can take advantage of bike trails and multi-use trails




Northstar is center stage in rapidly-growing Ramsey

Despite being an exurb, Ramsey is well-connected to the region's transportation system by car, bike, and train.

Ramsey has many multi-use trails, like the **Mississippi River Trail (MRT)**, which connects to other parts of the County as well as Minneapolis and St. Paul for bike commuters.

Ramsey's "COR" development prominently features hundreds of apartment units and a **free municipal parking ramp for commuters at Ramsey's Northstar station**. Highway 10 cuts through Ramsey, providing a short drive to major transit hubs like Northtown and Foley Blvd Park and Ride, where buses come more often outside of rush hour, offering more flexibility.

Example Commutes

-  **Ramsey Station to Target Field**
Northstar Southbound - 36 min
-  **Ramsey Station to U of M**
Northstar Green Line - 53 min
-  **Ramsey Station to Downtown St. Paul**
Carpool from Ramsey Station - 45 min

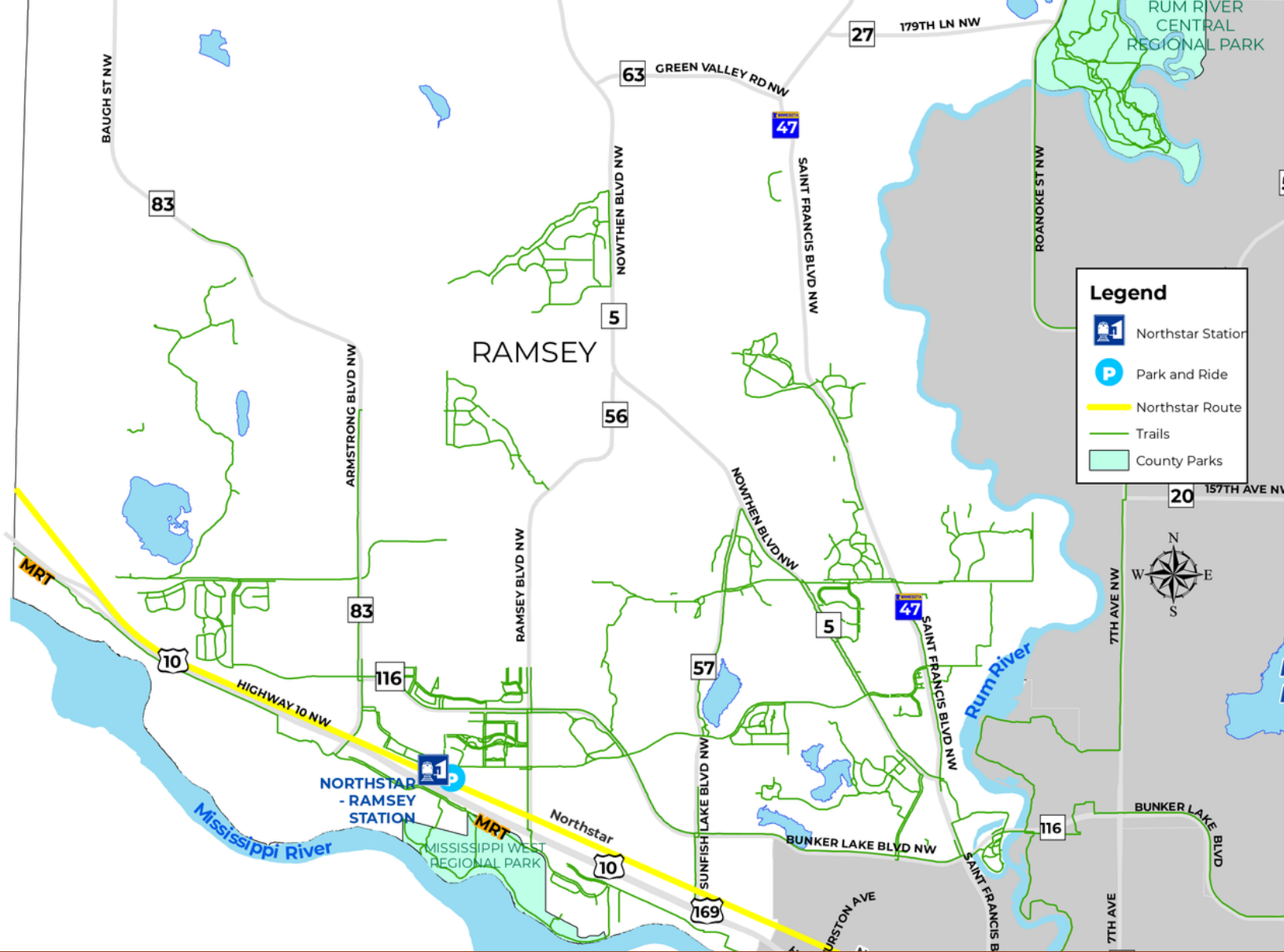


Northstar Commuter Rail service is the fastest way to downtown on transit, and in winter can be as much as 20-30 minutes faster than driving.

Transit Link

Transit Link is the region's dial-a-ride service that is used for areas without fixed-route buses and will typically connect customers to fixed route services to get to their destination. **Call 763-324-3250 to get started.**





Park & Ride

Free municipal park and ride ramp attached to the Northstar station

Ramsey's primary transit mode is the Northstar Line, located in south Ramsey. Trains run between Minneapolis and Big Lake during weekday rush hour only, with special service for Vikings games.

Commuters looking for more flexibility can try using Park & Rides in Coon Rapids or Blaine, which have hourly daytime trips in both directions. Try Route 850 or 250.



Biking

Miles of multi-use paths along major roads that connect to cities along the river

Many major destinations in Ramsey are accessible by bike. Bike to the train station for a car-free commute to downtown and use your bike to navigate one of the most bicycle-friendly cities in America.

Take advantage of EZPass lanes and split fuel costs
