

The Anoka County Housing Team can assist with the following:

- Gaining access to permanent housing resources.
- Supplying resources to prevent homelessness by providing shelter and emergent housing options/ referrals.
- Providing landlord/tenant education and resources.
- Accessing housing applications and application strategies.
- Navigating barriers such as criminal/ credit/rental history.
- Connecting to mental health resources, medical insurance, transportation, housing navigation programs, public assistance benefits, resources for moving.
- Consulting with community providers.
- Offering in-person support at the monthly housing clinics located at the Blaine Human Service Center.

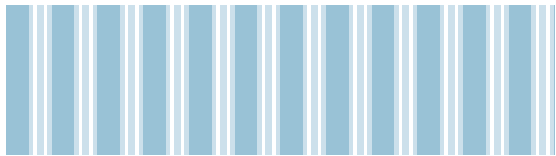

Housing Help Desk

The Housing Help Desk is able to:

- Link clients to homeless outreach staff, shelter providers, and community –based resources.
- Offer guidance regarding eligibility criteria for housing resources and public assistance programs such as HUD, Project Based Section 8, voucher programs, and Economic Assistance programs.
- Provide information on how to navigate the subsidized housing application process for those that are disabled and/or low income.
- Offer information related to supportive and affordable housing resources.

Housing Outreach Worker

A Housing Outreach Worker (HOW) is available to address housing barriers, assist with housing search navigation, and coordinate with Social Service providers.

In order to qualify, clients must have a disabling condition and be experiencing homelessness or at imminent risk of homelessness.

Referrals are accepted from Anoka County staff and community partners.
